



Create an understanding of what is a curriculum and push for policy change where that understanding of the curriculum becomes a reality.




MANHAJNA's MISSION

Use the collected data to organize a timely advocacy campaign (platforms and conferences) targeting decision makers.




- Provide a safe space for all stakeholders to voice their concerns.

We aim to bring about a change at the policy level that leads to the birth of a new Lebanese curriculum.






